VIII. BUSINESS

A. Maurice Stadler discussed moving \$10,000 from FVCA checking account to the Vanguard account in order to increase investment income.

- 1. Karl Holub made a motion to move \$10,000 from the FV checking account to the Vanguard account. John Moyell seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
- B. Jim Egger provided an update regarding the proposed Amendment to Deed Restrictions. The Board has collected more than 180 consent forms for the 3rd Amendment to the Deed Restrictions and will continue collecting consent forms through March 7, 2015. Nete Sundt will work with the FVCA Secretary to confirm the list of FVCA members that is maintained by Best Fit Solutions. The final count of consent forms will be performed on Sunday, March 8, 2015. All paperwork will be completed by the FVCA President and forwarded to Attorney Rick Butler to be reviewed and filed appropriately. In addition, once the amendment to the Deed Restrictions is completed, the additional paperwork to finalize the merger will be submitted to the attorney and filed appropriately. The target date to complete the merger of the FVCA and the FV Swim Club is April 1, 2015 or earlier.
- C. Karl Holub noted that, due to increasingly complex construction in the neighborhood, review of new construction plans for compliance with the architectural standards goes beyond what can be handled by and/or expected of volunteers. He recommends retaining a professional firm for this purpose and charging a fee for review of plans. Paul Dunne noted that it appears that the architectural standards are out of date and vague and recommended review of the standards as a first step.
- D. Jim Egger recommended reviewing the FVCA documents currently in storage, purging the documents that do not need to be retained in accordance with the documentation retention policy, storing the remaining documents in a safe deposit box (as necessary) and with Best Fit Solutions, and vacating the storage unit. Maurice Stadler offered to store the holiday decorations temporarily.
- E. The Board held Open Discussion and took questions.

IX. ADJOURN

Jim Egger made a motion to adjourn the meeting. John Moyell seconded the motion. The motion was approved. The meeting was adjourned at 8:12 pm.

A. Law Enforcement Update - Constable Precinct 5 - Sgt. Janice Grizzaffi

- DEA bust on Memorial & Wilcrest number of cars (15) involved. Large cache of drugs, money, and weapon recovered
- There have been several arrests involving the cartel involved in a number of house burglaries associated with "the woman with long blonde hair". Although a several arrests have been made, Constable asks to keep your eyes/ears open.
- If you are leaving for Spring Break, please advise via the Vacation Watch program.
 It is now available online
- No statistics available at meeting time. These will be posted on the Super Neighborhood website when they become available.

B. Houston City Council Update – Dist G Communications Director – Mark Kirschke

- Memorial Drive Reconstruction Project looking to award construction contracts in July 2015 with scheduled construction start mid Sept 2015
- COH has announced that it will run water lines to the esplanades as part of the construction program
- No re-surfacing of the tennis courts at Bendwood Park will occur. The courts will be re-lined. NOTE: Councilman Pennington along with the PW&E program manager will meet at Bendwood Park on 6March15 to walk through and discuss improvements to be considered.
- COH will spend about \$3-4 K per park for remulching playground area that do not meet current standards.
- COH will spend ~ \$200K on a program to repair portions of Eldridge Pkwy. This is not a pothole repair program. It will look at replacing the eleven (11) worst concrete panels in the area.
