Detention South of I-10

Mano DeAyala of SBMSA is trying to kickstart a renewed push in support of the TIRZ17 detention project at the SBMSA ballfields south of Mac Haik Ford. The area group headed by Bruce Nichols is asking that as many individuals and civic associations as possible send the enclosed letter to COH and TIRZ17 members. Letter can be sent by email. Should go to the mayor, district G, all the at large council members; copy to Ann Givens (chair of TIRZ) and Scott Bean (TIRZ executive director).

Mano will be speaking publically about supporting the detention project at the District G CIP meeting on Tuesday, March 07, 2017. 6:30-8:00pm, Paul Revere Middle School, 10502 Briar Forest Dr., Houston, TX 77042.

Mayor Sylvester Turner, Members of Houston City Council and TIRZ 17 Board

TIRZ 17 was established nearly 17 years ago with a promise to build water detention facilities to alleviate flooding south of I-10. Prior TIRZ 17 boards have not kept their promises. You have a major opportunity to correct an injustice being done to homeowners south of – and downstream from -- commercial development along I-10 between Beltway 8 and Bunker Hill Road. We, the undersigned, urge you to seize this chance and do the right thing to mitigate flooding that is damaging neighborhoods, undermining retirees' savings and causing widespread misery.

Please push forward with TIRZ 17's plan, already approved by City Council, to install subsurface detention on the Spring Branch Memorial Sports Association ("SBMSA") dedicated playing fields behind Mac Haik Ford. This project will reduce overland sheet flow surging southward into our neighborhoods during heavy rains. Storm water would be detained, kept out of homes and other structures, until storm sewers in the area can accept it.

An engineering study done for TIRZ 17 shows this project to be technically feasible. From an economic standpoint, it is by far the most cost-effective solution. There is little undeveloped land in the area, and sites theoretically available for surface detention are prohibitively expensive. Alternatives for subsurface projects, including detention under the Memorial City parking lots, are much more costly. Big-box culverts down Gessner to Buffalo Bayou face Harris County Flood Control's ban on increased rates of flow into the bayou. Neighborhoods would resist, feeling they shouldn't have to risk giving up the residential character of Gessner in exchange for flood relief.

The latest TIRZ 17 subsurface detention plan is the best option, and it has been endorsed by SBMSA and by the affected neighborhoods. Bringing this plan to fruition will keep a 17-year-old promise made to win neighborhood support for TIRZ 17 when it was created. Although very late, it is time TIRZ 17 and the City honored its promise.

Residential homeowners are the heart and soul of any city. While homeowners owe their allegiance, support and tax dollars to the city, the city has a reciprocal moral and political obligation to do its best to protect homeowners' investments, in most cases a big part of their life savings. Those mutual responsibilities are the glue that holds a community together. Homeowners have done their part. It is time for the city, and its agent, TIRZ 17, to do their part. Please follow through on this plan to keep an old promise and honor a basic municipal obligation.
